## **Minority Business Commission Meeting**

Smith began the meeting with a review of October's meeting minutes. No changes were made. Menafee motioned to approve. All ayes.

Smith transitioned to amend the MBC bylaws. No changes were made. Menafee motioned to approve. All ayes.

Smith gave an update on OED programming. The BEF mini-grant application closed and 16 preliminary selections were made (12 black-owned, 2 woman-owned, 2 minority-owned). The fourth cohort of GO Start-Up is underway and class will begin on Monday, February 8<sup>th</sup> with 10 students.

Hawthorne presented Procurement numbers for last quarter. Lee asked about capturing minority-owned businesses in self-identifying option for submission. Brown brought up the need to increase City spending with minority-owned businesses.
