### Review Bylaws - Brian M./All

The only changes proposed were adding an amendment addressing electronic meetings. It was also suggested to add changes to the first paragraph to include emphasis on public health, education and advocacy. Brian will return with these changes along with a mission statement and goals for the July meeting.

#### Other Housekeeping - Brian

June 11th is the closing date for applications for the only open seat on the Tree Commission.

### Wasps and Emerald Ash Borer Presentation - Patrick B.

Patrick explains how the USDA has switched efforts to try to help to control EAB using a biological control, releasing a parasitoid wasp which lays its eggs inside of EAB eggs. USDA approached the Parks Dept. in search of a suitable location for release which was identified as Ragged Mountain. After the presentation and questions, the Tree Commission voted in favor of supporting this effort and the recommendation of the city arborist with Peggy casting the only dissenting vote.

#### **Public Comment**

Joan Fenton asked if the Parks Dept. would be able to put a planter or vegetation where the Norway maples will be removed at Central Place. Joan also asked if it were possible to plant a tree in the hole where the Holiday tree is put annually.

Mike will explore options of putting greenspace back where the trees are coming out at central place and return with an answer next month. Planting a tree in the Holiday Tree hole is not feasible since it is only a concrete hole without soil.

#### **BYLAWS**

#### OF

#### CITY OF CHARLOTTESVILLE TREE COMMISSION

### **ARTICLE 1 – PURPOSE**

advise and assist City Council, the Planning Commission, and City staff in the planting, protection, preservation, and removal of trees located on public right-of-ways and public property. In monitoring these public trees, the Commission strives to protect and improve the urban forest to provide better quality of life and health outcomes for City residents and to secure meaningful environmental and aesthetic benefits. To achieve these objectives, the Commission works to enhance the diversity and health of the City's tree canopy, educates the community about the critical importance of trees, and advocates for public and private resources and engagement. The Commission remains informed about local changes and intentions involving trees as well as plans for public lands and City infrastructure. When and where appropriate, the Commission advises on protection of trees and tree canopy on private property.

#### **ARTICLE 2 – MEMBERSHIP**

- 2.1 <u>Members</u>. The Commission shall consist of thirteen (13) persons:
  - ten (10) citizen members, at least two (2) of whom reside in low-income neighborhoods
  - one (1) representative of the Planning Commission
  - one (1) representative of the Charlottesville Area Tree Stewards (or its successor organization)
  - the City Arborist, serving ex-officio
- 2.2 <u>Appointment and Length of Term.</u> Citizen members of the Commission shall be appointed by City Council. The term of service shall be three (3) years, with members eligible to serve a maximum of two (2) consecutive terms, except as set forth in article 2.3.
- 2.3 <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy of a citizen member's seat resulting from death, resignation, or otherwise, shall be advertised and a new member shall be appointed by City Council at the earliest possible opportunity. A person appointed to fill a vacant seat shall complete the unexpired portion of the term of that seat. Upon completing that term, they shall be eligible, if appointed by City Council, to serve up to two full three (3) year terms.
- 2.4 <u>Attendance</u>. A member who during any twelve (12) month period fails to attend at least 75% of the Commission's meetings, including its regularly scheduled

meetings and those of its committees, shall be subject to removal by the affirmative vote of a majority of the number of members serving at that time.

2.5 <u>Compensation</u>. Members shall serve without compensation.

#### **ARTICLE 3 – MEETINGS**

- 3.1 <u>Frequency</u>. The Commission shall, at a minimum, meet quarterly, or as called by the Chair with notice of no less than ten (10) calendar days.
- 3.2 Quorum. At all meetings of the Commission, the presence of a majority of the number of members then serving will be sufficient to constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business. The act of the majority of members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Commission. Less than a quorum of members may adjourn any meeting.

#### **ARTICLE 4 – OFFICERS**

- 4.1 <u>Nomination and Election</u>. At its first meeting each calendar year, the Commission shall elect from among its citizen members a Chair and Vice Chair upon an affirmative vote of a majority of the number of members then serving.
- 4.2 <u>Term</u>. The Chair and Vice Chair shall serve for a period of twelve (12) months and may serve consecutive terms.

#### ARTICLE 5 – COMMITTEES

5.1 The Commission may, by resolution duly adopted, establish such committees as it may deem advisable. The members, terms, and authority of a committee shall be set forth in the resolution establishing it.

#### ARTICLE 6 – STAFF SUPPORT

6.1 The Director of the Parks and Recreation Department shall assign staff to support the Commission. Other City departments may provide support as needed.

#### **ARTICLE 7 – AMENDMENTS**

7.1 These Bylaws may be amended at any duly called meeting of the Commission after written notice of such purpose has been given at least five (5) days prior to such meeting. Notice shall include a copy of the proposed amendment(s) or a summary of the changes to be effected thereby. The affirmative vote of a majority of the number of members then serving is required to amend the Bylaws.


Project Purpose: To address the environmental inequity in Charlottesville's low canopy neighborhoods by developing a public private partnership to fund projects for more canopy trees, green spaces and an increased appreciation of nature and its health benefits.

### Presenting Issues

- Current research shows that residential zones below 40% tree canopy are considered unhealthy neighborhoods where residents suffer from increased heat related illnesses, higher energy costs and poorer air quality, conditions that are not associated with Charlottesville's "greener" or higher income neighborhoods.
- Nine of Charlottesville's neighborhoods are below 40% tree canopy and two,10th and Page and Starr Hill, are below 20% coverage. These last two neighborhoods correspond with predominantly African-American and low-income neighborhoods that were historically subjected to racially inequitable planning and development policies.
- With the increasing heat of climate change, these "heat island" neighborhoods will suffer disproportionally from heat related stress and illnesses, as well as increased energy costs.
- Most of the available land in these low canopy neighborhoods is on private property with very little public land for the City to plant trees or develop green spaces.
- The Covid pandemic has shown the importance of access to nature and the outdoors for the mental and physical health of our children and families. Simply a walk in the woods or a park may be the secret to good health.
- City planners should treat trees, green spaces and nature as part of the City's infrastructure – as important as roads, sidewalks and utilities.

### Solution/Goals

- Form an alliance of the Tree Commission, The Virginia Chapter of The Nature Conservancy (TNC), the City of Promise and a group of corporate and private citizens to promote and enhance trees, nature and green spaces in the City, especially in low canopy neighborhoods.
- Set community-advised fund at the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation. (CACF) with an initial grant of \$20,000 from The Virginia Chapter of The Nature Conservancy, \$5000 from Van Yahres Tree Company and \$5000 from an anonymous donor.
- Solicit one-time matching funds from the City of Charlottesville to expand the fund and leverage additional funds from local businesses, and individuals who support trees, nature and environmental justice.

 Create an advisory committee composed of representatives from the current and past Tree Commission, the City of Promise, TNC, and our initial corporate sponsor, Van Yahres Tree Company, to oversee these funds.

### Proposed Projects to Fund

- Tree planting on private property.
- · Outdoor and nature events for kids and families.
- Grants to teachers for activities involving nature and outdoor activities.
- Events for teens to introduce them to careers in tree and environmental related industries.
- Development of outdoor green spaces.

### Initial Strategy

- The first focus will be on the 10th and Page neighborhood which has a 19.3% tree canopy, the lowest in the City and therefore, one of the first neighborhoods to experience environmental and health distress under climate change.
- Parks and Recreation, working with the City of Promise and the neighborhood schools, will develop and coordinate events to promote the benefits of trees, nature and the outdoors with kids and families.
- Fund the City of Promise to do outreach and CATS to plant trees in the neighborhood. Teenagers from The City of Promise and other volunteers would be responsible for community outreach and CATS would plant the trees using volunteers from our committee, the neighborhood and other interested organizations.

### Expected Results · Short Term in 10th & Page

- Plant one tree for every school-age kid in 3 years
- Hold one environmental event a year
- Fund at least 2 teacher-developed nature activities a year
- Enhance one outdoor public space in three years

### Expected Results • Long Term

Increased tree canopy in all neighborhoods under 40% canopy

- Reduced "heat island" impacts on health and energy costs
- Increased appreciation, access and use of natural areas by the neighborhoods
- Successful strategies that will support similar efforts in other neighborhoods and schools throughout the city.

#### Leaves save lives

#### C. Outreach



#### 3. Fall 2022


• With Tree Stewards, Tree Commission, TNC, neighbors, and others plant trees. Make it an event.



### Tree Conservation - Nomination Form

In November 2013, Charlottesville City Council adopted the Tree Conservation Ordinance regulating the preservation and removal of Heritage, Specimen, Memorial and Street Trees, (Chapter 18 (Parks and Recreation), Article II, Tree Conservation) in order to secure protection for a portion of the City's urban forest and the ecosystem services that this forest provides.

The ordinance can be used to protect individual trees on public land, or privately owned individual trees that property owners voluntarily agree to safeguard. Individual property owners and the Tree Commission may nominate trees. Four categories of trees can be considered: **specimen**, **heritage**, **memorial**, **and street trees**. As defined by Virginia State law, specimen trees are those that are notable in their size and quality for their species. Heritage trees have historical or cultural interest. Memorial trees can be designated to commemorate a person, group or life event. Street trees are those that have been planted by the City within a public right-of-way on public or private land. The Tree Commission reviews and City Council decides if nominated trees are worthy of this special status.

At a later date, six more Pin Oaks were planted along Garrett Street from 6th Street to Avon Street. These trees range from 14" DBH to 24" DBH.

STREET TREES					
In 2016 when Charlottesville was developing the Streets That Work Design Manual, the City used these two streets as a demonstration project to show the community the value of streets lined with large, shade trees. These oaks were important then and just as important now. It is well documented that large trees sequester carbon and other pollutants, decrease storm water and improve health, particularly by reducing the heat index. When Friendship Court was built, the City also wanted to beautifully define the neighborhood with street trees along its edges.  As Friendship Court is developed, these large trees located at the edge of the neighborhood may be the only large trees that can be perserved. By nominating these trees, the developers will be made aware of their importance and try to save as many as possible.



# REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS HISTORIC DOWNTOWN MALL TREE MANAGEMENT PLAN

**DRAFT** – June 2021

NOTE: UPON REVIEW AND FINALIZATION, THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE WILL BE INCORPORATED INTO THE CITY'S STANDARD REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) PROCUREMENT DOCUMENT. FOR EASE OF REVIEW, PROCUREMENT BOILERPLATE LANGUAGE IS OMITTED FROM THIS DRAFT.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this Request for Proposal ("RFP") is to solicit <u>sealed</u> proposals from qualified firms to develop a Tree and Infrastructure Management Plan ("Plan") for the City of Charlottesville's ("City") historic downtown pedestrian mall. The City seeks professional services in the areas of arboriculture, landscape architecture, urban design, and community process facilitation, as well as in other areas of expertise outlined in this RFP. Significant community engagement with local stakeholders will be required of the successful offeror.

BACKGROUND: The Downtown Mall ("Mall") is an eight-block long pedestrian street designed by Lawrence Halprin & Associates ("Halprin") as part of a Charlottesville downtown revitalization project in the early 1970s. The Mall is a notable example of Halprin's modernist approach to urbanism that reflects as well local values expressed during a series of community design workshops conducted at the time. Significant as a work of modern landscape architecture and innovative design, the Mall is a nationally recognized streetscape noted for the significant contribution of large healthy trees to the public space. It has remained a vibrant and beloved public space for residents and visitors for nearly half a century.

The Mall encompasses approximately the area between Water Street and McIntire Road on the west and City Hall and the Downtown Visitors Center on the east. This area includes side streets between East Market Street on the north, and Water Street on the south (including 2<sup>nd</sup> Street on the west through 5<sup>th</sup> Street on the east). The Mall is part of the Charlottesville/Albemarle County Courthouse National Register Historic District and the Downtown Architectural Design Control District. It is managed and maintained by several City departments and receives design and preservation oversight from the City's Board of Architectural Review.

STATEMENT OF NEEDS: The Mall Tree Management Plan should provide guidelines for the long-term management of the Mall as a constructed and planted landscape of historical and cultural significance, with considered attention to trees as an essential element of the design. Research, documentation, and analysis undertaken according to national standards for preservation of historical sites and trees—accompanied by coordinated input from local entities and

stakeholders—will provide a foundation for the long-term management and protection of the trees and related constructed elements of the Mall's infrastructure. As the goal is not to preserve the Mall in one "historic" condition, the guidelines should help the City undertake careful tree preservation and replacement and sensitively-designed repairs and modifications that support the Mall's current use and protect its distinctive historic character and features.

The Mall should be viewed as both an important *designed space* for the community and a central piece of the City's *infrastructure*. Because the Mall is a primary social and entertainment destination for both residents and visitors, it requires a robust lifecycle and maintenance plan for its trees and constructed elements. The Plan must account for the preservation of the Mall's historic elements and for its long-term structural viability and maintenance. It should respect the design goals established by Halprin's plan, allow for the use of present and future technology (i.e., soil vaults, tree grates), and adjust to evolving community expectations.

Although the Plan should not address privately owned land or buildings in the Mall area, it should evaluate certain situations as they relate to the public domain, including ADA accessibility, among others. In addition, the Plan must account for its impact on City departments and governing bodies, other local agencies, and private utilities and should offer recommendations for coordination, cooperative planning, and efficient decision-making. The goal is a cohesive and coherent plan for proper stewardship of this significant community asset.

There are a range of elements that will allow the City to pursue a structured and sustainable plan to ensure the survivability, long-term health of the groves of trees on the Mall and sensible replacement strategy. The following are considered essential.

#### **Elements of a Tree and Infrastructure Management Plan**

- Consolidate and memorialize past studies and recommendations
- Report on inventory and condition of trees, including their relationship to constructed elements (e.g., grates, bricks, lighting, outdoor dining)
- Develop a lifecycle and maintenance plan for the Mall's trees
- Summarize responsibilities by City departments and other local agencies, with recommendations on improvements
- Summarize decision-making processes and entities involved, with recommendations on improvements. (e.g., Board of Architectural Review, Tree Commission, Downtown Business Association, City Council, etc.)
- Recommend how to anticipate, adapt to, and accommodate changes in technology
- Recommend prioritization of maintenance and improvements; programming and budget estimates: (i.e., immediate remediation; as needed; ongoing maintenance; short-, mid- and long-term planning; etc.)
- Recommend a dedicated funding stream, with primary emphasis on an approach for securing Capital Improvement Program (CIP) allocations
- Conduct design outreach to stakeholders whose input is essential to the success of the Plan

 Establish a steering committee consisting of City departments (Parks and Recreation, Neighborhood Development Services (NDS), Public Works), City boards and commissions (Board of Architectural Review and Tree Commission), and central stakeholders, including the Downtown Business Association

#### Elements and Components to be Evaluated and Addressed

- Examine existing conditions and inventory, assessing on a block-by-block and individual basis.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses of current design as function of tree health and Mall utilization.
- Evaluate/calculate the ecological impacts/benefits of Mail trees. Quantify what storm water reduction, air quality and energy conservation benefits.
- Evaluate/calculate economic impacts, benefits, and contributions of the trees.
- Examine effects of trees' values as a function of retail pricing, place perception, patronage behavior and property value. Examine impact of tree removal (of varying degrees) and recommend scenarios, including business impact mitigation plans.
- Propose short- and mid-term solutions: Tree preservation plans to extend tree life. Plans to be implemented immediately and as outlined in a 10-year program. Include outline costs estimates, anticipated effectiveness, and implementation sequencing and timing.
- Long-term solutions: Provide minimum of two prescriptive, viable and practical tree replacement strategies; strategies must consider many interest groups and stakeholders; development must include extensive public outreach. C (I thought they had to establish a steering committee. See last bullet in section above.)
- Economic impact on Mall businesses regarding replacement strategies of trees. Provide
  options ranked by potential impacts to businesses and the community; include mitigation
  options. Political viability should be considered along with community response to
  proposals that are perceived as or represent variations from the Halprin design. Strategies
  should include costs estimates, anticipated effectiveness, and implementation sequencing
  and timing.
- Provide recommendations on tree grating (or sidewalk/tree interface alternative), including Halprin design and current applications
- Evaluate use of seasonal outdoor heaters relative to trees
- Relationship of trees to street ceiling: Tree line, relationship to building facades.

#### Halprin Design

- Identify/preserve critical elements of Halprin's design and design intent
- Recommend elements that must be preserved; incorporated into Mall extension(s)
- Establish a design ethos that respects Halprin's plan while accommodating change
- Incorporate the planned Vinegar Hill Park

#### **Evaluate Street Cross-section**

Concrete slab

- Gravel substrate
- Soil substrate
- Drainage/storm water management (including gutters and downspouts—clogged, overflowing, etc.)

#### Evaluate Tree relationship to artificial lights

- Lighting of trees and other spaces in terms of safety

- Holiday lights

#### Review Public Experience

- Outdoor Vendors
- Events and other programmed activities
- Outdoor dining relationship to trees

  - o Emergency (storm damage, etc.) repairs
  - Spot improvements (Heaving pavers, other conflicts)
  - Planned modifications/replacements
  - Capital projects

#### Miscellaneous

- Suggest requirements for tree protection during construction work [public and private] that require Mall access or disruption: proscribed work times, construction fencing, sidewalk safety, etc.
- Assess non-city utility issues (power; communications; underground work; rights of way conflicts; etc.) (?)



# Charlottesville Parks and Recreation Department Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Plan FY 2022-2027



Declining green ash trees in Craw Garden 5-27-2021

#### **Purpose**

The most immediate threat to Charlottesville's urban forest and the safety of its residents is posed by the rapid spread of the emerald ash borer, which will kill 100% of our untreated ash trees. The funds needed to address this threat are time-sensitive and safety-critical. Unlike most trees which die slowly, an infected ash tree becomes extremely brittle and breaks apart quickly, posing a significant danger to people and property. Sufficient funding is essential to deal with ash tree removal, mitigation and other strategies to provide public safety.

#### Background

Emerald ash borer is an invasive insect from Siberia that is expected to kill all untreated ash trees. 1-2% of Charlottesville's urban forest consists of ash trees (approximately 330 trees). *Unfortunately, these trees are present in large numbers in our parks and particularly in flood plains (e.g., Riverview, Disc Golf, and Greenbrier Trail) where impacts will be considerable*.

Thirty-one of the city's largest, most valuable ash trees were selected in 2016 for ongoing preventative treatment. Costs and other prohibitive measures prevent all ash trees from being treated. For those trees selected for treatment, the investment offsets the costs of removal, and the community continues to realize the aesthetic and environmental benefits that the trees provide.

#### **Anticipated Budget Impact**

Approximately 300 ash trees will need to be removed over the next five fiscal years at an estimated total cost of \$480,600. This total is based on an average cost of \$1602 per ash tree removed since fiscal year 2017 and does not include the cost of planting trees to offset these removals. It should be noted that the estimate of 300 trees may increase as additional infected trees are identified as a result of property line and right-of-way variations.

The annual cost of treating the 31 ash trees selected for retention is approximately \$8,425. Thus the total cost for removals and treatment of ash trees over the next five years is \$522,725.

#### **Budget for Removal of Dead and Dying Trees**

Ash trees will be removed when they pose an unacceptable risk to people and property as determined by the industry standard ISA Tree Risk Assessment. For this to occur in an orderly and safe manner in each of the next five fiscal years, when all untreated ash trees are projected to die and break apart, \$105,000 in annual funding will be required in addition to the Department's current tree maintenance budget.

Without this additional funding the cost to remove and treat Charlottesville's ash trees will reduce the annual urban forest budget of \$218,000 by half. Little will remain for clean up after storms, safety pruning, preventive measures for pests and diseases and proactive care to extend the life of our best mature trees. Such a significant reduction in routine tree maintenance will in turn pose a risk for personal safety and property damage, and it will visibly diminish the aesthetic and environmental benefits of the urban forest.

#### Removal Procedures for Dead and Dying Trees

Ash trees will be removed if they pose an unacceptable risk to people and property as defined by the ISA Tree Risk Assessment as the industry standard. Below is a proposed outline of how trees will be removed when dealing with EAB.

#### With additional 105,000.00 annual funding to address EAB affected trees

Groups or clusters that contain living, dead or dying ash trees will be scheduled for removal that pose a moderate risk or greater.

Trees that pose low risk such as trees that are in forested, generally unused areas, will remain for wildlife and for EAB to run its course.

#### With additional \$50,000.00 annual funding to address EAB affected trees

Dead and dying trees that are extreme, high and moderate risk will be scheduled for removal.

#### During periods of standard operation urban forestry budget (without additional funding)

Dead and dying trees that are high and extreme risk will be scheduled for removal.

High and extreme risk will be defined as: Posing a likely or very likelihood of failure of impact and having a high or very high consequences of failure.

Without additional funding the cost to remove and treat Charlottesville's ash trees could reduce the annual urban forest budget of \$218,000 fundamentally by half. Little will remain for clean up after storms, safety pruning, preventive measures for pests and diseases and proactive care to extend the life of our best mature trees. Such a significant reduction in routine tree maintenance will in turn pose a risk for personal safety and property damage, and it will visibly diminish the aesthetic and environmental benefits of the urban forest.

Low Risk Trees - Trees that pose low risk such as trees that are in forested, generally unused areas, will remain for wildlife and for EAB to run its course.

#### **Woody Debris Disposal for EAB**

Useable logs will be posted on the city's government surplus website so that the ash wood may be repurposed. Where applicable, woody debris will remain in natural areas in a safe manner to provide wildlife cover.
